## OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENTS

**Localized impact:** 13% of people reached through partner organizations.

### SURVIVE

**29,006** people now have access to essential water, sanitation and hygiene services.

**5,566** children under 5 years of age and pregnant or breastfeeding women reached in response to malnutrition.

**3,001** caregivers strengthened in key practices of feeding and childcare.

**2,797** people involved in anticipatory actions for climate risk reduction.

### LEARN

**23,343** girls and boys now study in protective and resilient environments in the face of humanitarian contexts.

**50%** of the children reached show progress in socio-emotional skills essential for learning, coexistence and well-being.

### PROTECTION

**98%** of caregivers report more positive relationships with children after participating in positive parenting programs.

**157** people received specialized care in child protection and emotional well-being.

### TOWARDS ADULTHOOD

**28,086** families mitigate negative survival strategies thanks to direct economic support.

**30%** of the participating households reported improved ability to meet their basic needs.

**33,125** people in climate crisis contexts now live in more resilient communities.

## CO-LED CAMPAIGNS WITH CHILDREN

Children and adolescents spearheaded actions to address structural inequalities and the climate crisis in their communities. With our partners, we amplified their voices and agendas to connect them with opportunities for advocacy.



**426 girls and boys + 84 youths** raised their voices in the face of the climate crisis

- ✓ Boys and girls achieved policy changes and improved services after strengthening their advocacy, communication, and campaigning skills in **Loreto and Andahuaylas**.
- ✓ We channeled the climate agenda of children and youth towards **COP30 in Brazil**, convening an intergenerational dialogue with high-level authorities in events and advocacy spaces.
- ✓ We contribute to the integration of the climate and environmental axis into the national construction process of the **Children's Agenda 2026-2031**, in response to the demand of organized children.

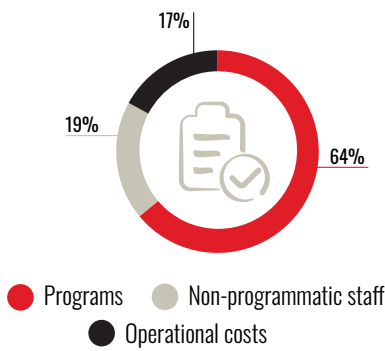
